La Gonave is a remote sparsely populated island 30 to 40 miles from mainland Haiti. Food and water is limited and all supplies must be transported. Living is primitive but safe with simple precautions. Expect everything to be Un-expected and trust your presence is because God has put it to you to help the poorest of the poor.

Security

The guest house is arranged in a dormitory style with cots that have foam mattresses, a pillow and clean linens. There is a room for dining and social activity and meals are taken in the guest house with the directors. There is electricity provided by generator until about 9 or 10 pm. Bath rooms are "up the hill". The guest house was built many years ago but windows are screened and it is well cleaned before teams arrive.



Air transportation to Haiti is limited and transportation to the island is even more difficult and costly. Costs depend on prices of fuel and difficulty of the travel both by sea and land. Sail-boat and ferry are dependent on weather and teams will not be endangered. Teams will be met in PaP and accompanied by the directors to the island.

Foods are purchased only 2 days per week and there is no refrigeration other than ice. The cooks are experienced and food is safe.

Security is provided at the guest house during the day while teams are working. Showers are available and pillows and bedding are furnished including towels.

A safe is provided for passports and valuables while on La Gonave Small amounts if money can be exchanged on the island.
